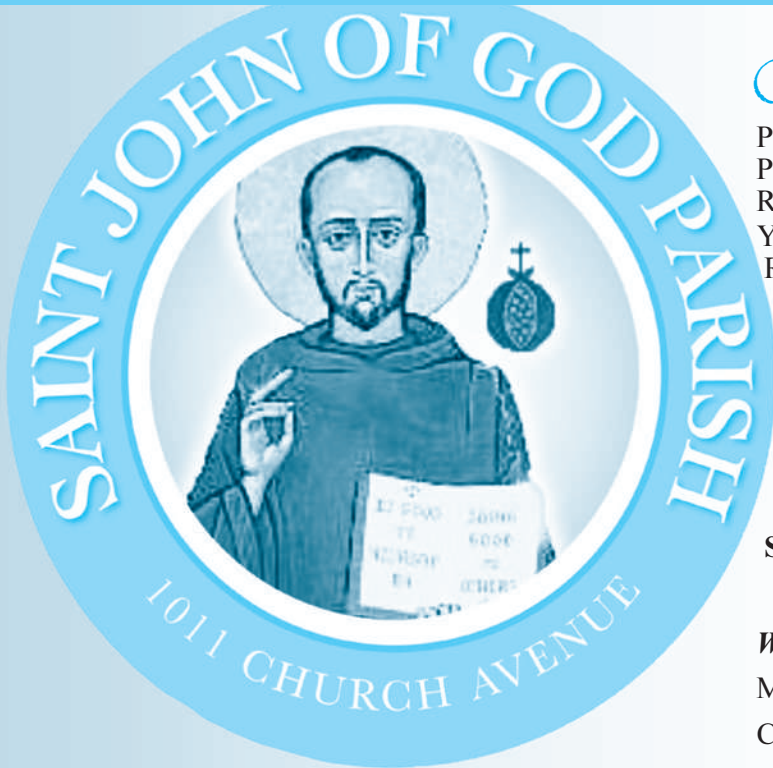

**PASTOR'S CORNER**  
**Fr. Lou Vallone**

A regularly scheduled Town Hall Meeting was held in the Church following the Ascension Thursday Mass. The following are some of the considerations covered that evening.

1. With the retirement of Sr. Theresa, we must make accommodations for our Bereavement Ministry and our Social Service Ministry. I have requested the assignment of one of the new permanent deacons to the parish, and have also had contact with one of the current permanent deacons. If one or both of those initiatives pan out, these ministries will become diaconal ones. If not, we will go to plan B, whatever that is. We should know by July 1 where we stand. In the meantime, we will make do.

2. The plant at Mother of Sorrows has become a problem. Vandals have disabled all of the air conditioning by stealing the copper. We have placed a security system there (don't walk your dog behind the building!) We will not be able to make repairs this summer (if at all). I am open to discussion how to use the facility during the summer. There will be no change in our use of it during the school year since we need it for educational programs.

3. Our covenant relationship with St. Malachy School has gone well for the first year and we look forward to it getting even better. We have used about \$48,000 in Angel Fund monies to supplement tuitions for our students there. The Angel Fund is currently sufficient for this year, but we can always use contributions. Remember, it is Parish Share exempt.

4. We still have an outstanding debt of \$100,000 in unpaid bills from the closing of the school, all owed to the diocese for insurance. I have been negotiating with the diocese on how to resolve that. Whatever the resolution is, these funds will be credited as school subsidy, and will be Parish Share discounted as well.

5. There will be changes in the translations that we use for Mass beginning the first Sunday of Advent. This is so that the entire English speaking world will use the same translations. The changes in the people's parts are not very many, and they will be in the Missalettes. It means that for a while we will have to read the responses again instead of praying them from memory. The biggest change is in the priests' parts. I have no comment at this time until I have taken the 6 hour training session at the end of June. Count on hearing more after that.

6. I will no longer teach in Rome in the month of June, but I have taken a new position with Catholic Leadership Institute as a learning leader for the Good Leaders Good Shepherds program for priests. I will be

away for half of June, in Philadelphia and Los Angeles, as well as several other times during the year in Baltimore and other places. The total amount of time is the same as I have been teaching in the past, just distributed differently. It will involve very few weekends, so most won't even notice.

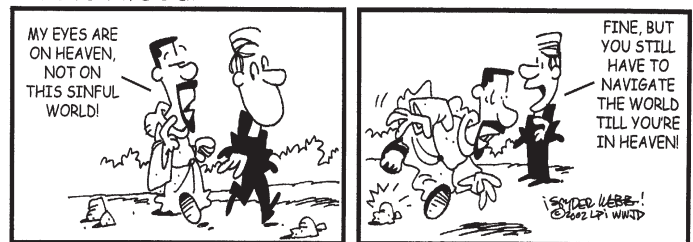
7. Fr. Al Semler has come back to Pittsburgh for the summer (he got tired of being retired, so had to take a vacation from it.) He will substitute for me on the occasions I am gone this summer.

8. We continue to spend quite a bit of money on the physical plant - roofs, electrical work, etc. None of these projects reach the level of major renovation, but are necessary for day in day out operating. The Steeple Chase Fund has been critical in providing the necessary funds to work on these repairs. Thanks to one and all for continuing to support it. These funds are also Parish Share exempt.

9. Our operating budget is considerably higher than the past several years, and we are running deficit spending but our reserves have been covering it. My hope is that we will stabilize again during the next financial year. In the meantime, Parish Share overage helps us. While the yearly cash flow is an important factor, 5 year analysis is more accurate in determining our financial health. From that standpoint, it is only our debt, which with interest assessments, has now grown again to slightly over \$1 million that is a major concern. Our operating and repair budgets are within acceptable parameters for the time being.

All in all, God has been good to us, and you have been good to your parish. I am proud and happy to be Pastor of St. John of God as it enters its nineteenth year. Thank you and God bless you for loving your Church and parish so much.
