**Adult Baptism:** The R.C.I.A. program sees to the needs of adults who wish to become Catholic.

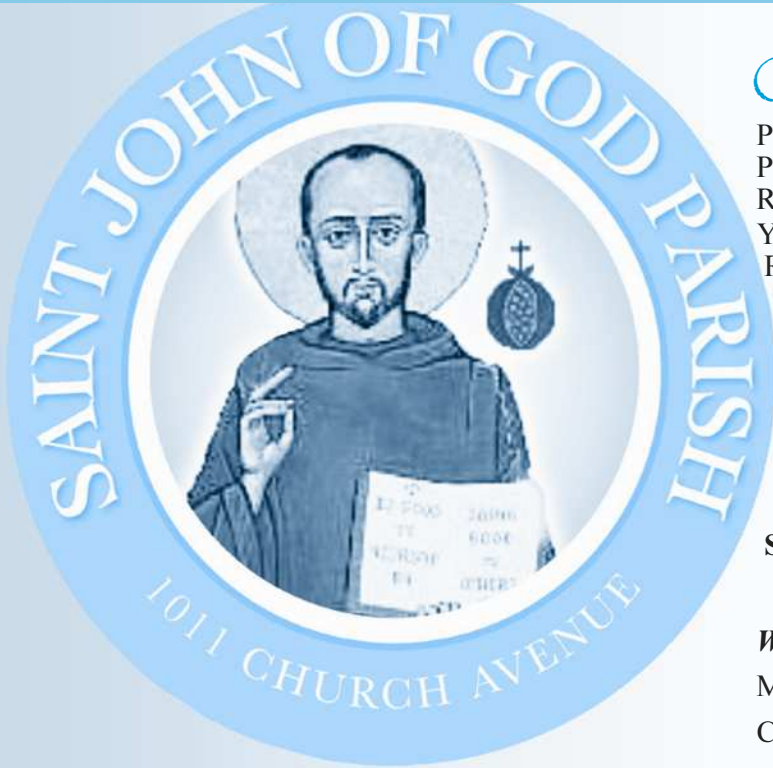
**Reconciliation (Confession):** 3:30 PM to 4:15 PM (Church) and following the 4:30 PM Mass (Church) and by appointment.

***The Pastor's Cornered***  
***17th Edition***

So today is it – Father's Day; a day we have been celebrating for over 100 years even though it wasn't an official U.S. holiday until 1972. There was some confusion over establishing a day to honor our fathers and it took several people over the course of many years and a few different tries, but it finally happened. It is with great pride and joy that we celebrate all of the fathers and father figures in our parish.

Aren't fathers great? Really, they are! Who else would - year after year - open up a gift on Father's Day and show such excitement over another tie or "soap on a rope" or, if you were one of the lucky dads, some new socks to replace your worn out, tattered ones? (it's ok dads, you can cringe here – I won't tell your family!) Unlike Mother's Day, it seems that celebrating father's day is tough. Moms get all kinds of goodies on Mother's Day. They get taken out to brunch or served breakfast in bed, they get flowers and chocolates and perfumes, they get visits from all of their children and are fussed over all day long! Fathers – not so much. Even the retailers and restaurants seem to place Dad in second standing. It's very hard to find a restaurant hosting a Father's Day brunch and the card shops seem to have only a half aisle displaying Father's Day cards. If you are looking for a less traditional Father's Day card to send to an Uncle or Godfather – you better shop early because those designs are hard to come by. So what is one to do especially if you are still trying to figure out how to make Dad's day special? How do we show the men in our lives how much we love them this father's day? You might have to get creative since the retailers have failed us, but you can't buy the best gifts at the mall anyway! The best gift you can give "dear ole Dad" is an experience with you and a memory to last a lifetime! Here are just a few suggestions. Some of these cost little to no money at all!

Instead of worrying about a gourmet meal, why not plan an ice cream bar instead and let dad go to town! Buy a few different flavors of ice cream and put out bowls of different toppings and let dad create his version of the best ice cream sundae!

Give dad his fantasy car – if only for the day! Rent your father the car he has always wanted and take it on the road for just the day. If this is out of your budget or you're still a little tike – buy a model of that car and help dad put it together!

Take dad to a water park and race him down the fast slides (or the lazy river if that is more his speed!).

If you already have a gift for Dad, why not send him on a Treasure Hunt to find the gift with little clues scattered throughout the house and yard – ending up in the dining room where a simple meal (men don't worry about food presentation nearly as much as women do) would be served!

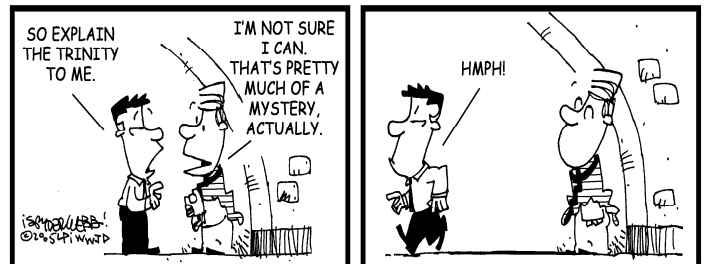
Have the kids (or pets) pose with letters spelling out D A D and place them in a tri-fold frame!

Ask Dad what his childhood dream was and try to make that happen – i.e. if he dreamed of being the star quarterback for the Pittsburgh Steelers – enroll him in the "Steelers Men's Fantasy Camp".

For a first time Daddy, mom can do a print of your baby's footprint and frame it on a page with this poem: Walk A Little Slower Daddy : I'm following in your footsteps - and I don't want to fall. Sometimes your steps are very fast, sometimes they're hard to see; So walk a little slower, Daddy, For you are leading me. Someday when I'm all grown up, You're what I want to be; Then I will have a little child - Who'll want to follow me. And I would want to lead just right, And know that I was true; So, walk a little slower, Daddy, For I must follow you.

Any of this can be adapted to meet your own particular needs. Whether you are honoring your own father, the father of your children, an Uncle, grandfather, Godfather or any father figure in your life; whatever you do - make this day about him. After all don't most dads make their lives about their kids! And don't fret if you are having a tough time coming up with the "perfect" gift... think about Jesus' dilemma – What do you get the Dad who IS everything!?! Have a very Blessed Father's Day!
